

Do You Have Questions About Medicare or Your Medicare Costs?

The Greater Erie Community Action Committee's Pennsylvania Medicare Education and Decision Insight, PA MEDI, Can Help

PA MEDI is a free health insurance counseling program that helps Pennsylvanians with Medicare. PA MEDI Counselors are trained to answer questions and provide objective, easy-to-understand information. PA MEDI also helps Medicare guide beneficiaries on how to apply for cost savings programs through the Extra Help and Medicare Savings Programs.

Extra Help can help lower your prescription co-payments and premiums – In 2024 if you are single with a total income of \$1,903 a month or less and your resources are \$17,220 or less, or if you are married with a total income of \$2,575 a month or less and your resources are \$34,360 or less.

Medicare Savings Program can help you with the payment of your Part B premium and possibly with the payment of your Medicare Part A and Part B cost-sharing – In 2024 if you are single with a total income of \$1,714 a month or less and your resources are \$9,430 or less, or if you are married with a total income of \$2,320 a month or less and your resources are \$14,130 or less.
