


**SNAP/EBT (food stamps)** can make online purchases and have delivered to their home, as per attached and same information below.

## Resources For Online SNAP Purchases

In Pennsylvania, residents who receive SNAP/EBT are now able to buy SNAP eligible foods and drinks online through Walmart and Amazon. These benefits can also be used to buy plants and seeds to grow food at home. This is a great way to get the food if you lived in a food desert or are unable to make it to the nearest grocery store.

## MEDICARE MINUTE...



### MEDICARE OPEN ENROLLMENT

The Medicare open enrollment period for 2026 will begin on October 7, 2025 and runs through Dec. 15, 2025. During this time, beneficiaries can review their current plans and make changes as needed. Key changes to Medicare in 2026 include new permanent benefits and adjustments to premiums for Part B and Part D. Additionally, the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) will release further details regarding Part D plans and offerings as the enrollment period approaches. It's important to stay informed about these changes to make the best choices for your coverage.

### \*\* Here are a few changes:

The Part B premium will be \$206.50.

If you were already enrolled in the Medicare Prescription Payment Plan (MIPP), you will be automatically re-enrolled.

The cap on out-of-pocket prescription drug costs will be \$2,100.

Your Insulin costs will be capped annually.

Free Vaccines are now a permanent feature of your Part D Plan. Double check with your Part D plan just to be sure!

Review your Medicare plan annually


Every year, Medicare beneficiaries have at least one opportunity to change plans; you can join, switch, or drop a Medicare Advantage Plan or Medicare Part D drug plan, switch to Original Medicare, or keep your current coverage. And if you've reviewed your options and you're happy with your current coverage, you don't need to do anything!
